

East Devon Orchards and the Wider World History, heritage, and bio-diversity

In land use terms, orchards present some of the most interesting features in the East Devon landscape, both in terms of history and biodiversity. However, orchards have also proved extremely vulnerable in recent times: there have been subsidies to uproot them and the patchwork of orchards within the heart of villages has inevitably fallen easy prey to infilling and development. Yet orchards are still with us today and even where they have disappeared they have left a trace in the documentary and cartographic record; in custom, culture, photography and in art - not to mention the apple varieties we still enjoy today. In this conference the economic, social, historical and biodiversity of orchards will all be explored, with presentations ranging from local research to international context.
